

Gift of Life Maternity Care Program Fact Sheet

The Gift of Life Maternity Care Program has contracted with doctors, certified nurse midwives, clinics, and care coordinators to provide prenatal care, care coordination, postpartum care, and delivery services for you while you are pregnant.

Read all the information on this page carefully. If you have questions about anything you do not understand, ask your care coordinator.

1. To enroll in the program you must apply for Medicaid. You must be eligible for Medicaid to participate in the Gift of Life Maternity Care Program. If you do not enroll and participate in the Gift of Life Maternity Care Program, Medicaid will not pay for any of your care.
2. To participate in the Gift of Life Maternity Care Program, you must live in one of these counties and choose a provider from your district's selection list:
District 6: Clay, Coosa, Randolph, Talladega, Tallapoosa
District 10: Autauga, Bullock, Butler, Crenshaw, Elmore, Lowndes, Montgomery, Pike
District 12: Baldwin, Clarke, Conecuh, Covington, Escambia, Monroe, Washington
3. You may only go to doctors, nurse midwives, and other maternity providers that are part of the Gift of Life Maternity Care Program.
4. **Medicaid will not pay for any of your maternity care if you go to any medical provider you are not enrolled with or one who is not part of the Gift of Life Maternity Care Program. You will be responsible for paying the bill, unless it is an emergency.**
5. Tell your care coordinator -
 - ✓ If you change your address or phone number.
 - ✓ If you move to another county or state.
 - ✓ If you missed a prenatal appointment.
 - ✓ If you had to go to the emergency room at a hospital for any reason.
 - ✓ If you have questions about the program or your care.
 - ✓ If you have a problem you need help with.
 - ✓ If you have a change with insurance coverage.
6. You should follow all the instructions given to you by your care coordinator and the doctor or nurse midwife you have chosen.
7. If you change your mind about your choice of who you want to provide your prenatal care and deliver your baby, you must first tell your care coordinator.
8. The white Gift of Life Enrollment Card given to you by your care coordinator shows your care coordinator's name and phone number, who you have chosen to deliver your baby, and 24-hour emergency phone numbers.
9. Keep your Medicaid card and your white Gift of Life Maternity Enrollment Card with you at all times. You will be asked to show both these cards during your pregnancy.
